

## Year One Autumn Newsletter 2023

Dear Parents,

Welcome to Year 1. It has been lovely getting to know your children over the last week and we hope they are happy and settled. We are currently planning our introductory meeting for parents which will be held in school on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September at 6pm. In this meeting, we will go through the teaching approaches, curriculum and routines of Year 1 - it will be lovely if you can make it.

This year, we are continuing to teach phonics through Little Wandle: Letters and Sounds Revised. We started our whole class lessons this week and the children are engaging really well and showing us what they learnt in Reception. From next Friday, the children will bring home 2 reading books which they will return to be changed the following Friday. As in Reception, the children are encouraged to read as much as they can from a range of books, either their school ones, ones they have at home or online. Any reading is welcomed and will count towards their 25 reads for Reading Champions this half term. Please therefore, ensure you comment in your child's reading diary each time they read at home — it doesn't need to be a full book — a few pages each day will allow your child to be a reading champion as we count the comments, not the number of books read.

We are very lucky to have outdoor learning in Year 1 this term. Forest School takes place on a Wednesday morning.

PE this half term is invasion games and we will be focusing on ball skills. Our PE session with Mr Jacobs is on a Monday and on Fridays we have Dance. Please can the children come dressed for PE on Monday's and Fridays and ready for Forest School on Wednesdays.

It is thirsty work in Year 1 so please make sure your child has a water bottle in school every day — thank you to those who are already doing this.

Our first topic this half term is themed around the book 'In Our Hands' by Lucy Farfort which the whole school are focussing on. We will then move on to learning about Our Bodies and Five Senses, Seasides and Toys in the Past.
