Dear Parents and carers,

We will also go outside everyday (weather permitting) to complete the Daily K. This is a lovely opportunity for the children to get some fresh air and exercise in the afternoon.

The children also have the chance to purchase a snack from the tuck shop on Thursday morning, you will need to send your child with no more than £2 to spend at the tuck shop.
