3.1 Why Fairtrade?

Fairtrade can make a difference to the lives of people throughout the world by improving living and working conditions for the people who grow and make the things we buy and use. Our school aims include teaching children to take increasing responsibility for themselves, the community and the environment and to embrace Christian values; in keeping with this we are committed to supporting, using and promoting Fairtrade wherever possible.

3.2 Supporting Fairtrade

The school supports Fairtrade by:

- ensuring that Fairtrade and the concept of 'fairness' are included in the curriculum and whole school activities
- promoting Fairtrade in the school and the wider community by taking part in Fairtrade Fortnight and completing Fairtrade challenges
- using Fairtrade products around the school wherever possible
 - o in the staff room, at school meetings and at school events
 - as part of the school meals service
 - o as ingredients for curriculum cooking and 'Let's Get Cooking'
 - for PE equipment
 - for any other resources
- encouraging parents and the wider community to support Fairtrade and to use Fairtrade products if possible
